Each year the EUROPEAN CULTURAL DAYS of the ECB give the public a taste of the cultural flair of one European Union Member State. This annual highlight is hosted by the European Central Bank together with the central bank of the Member State in the spotlight. In 2018 it is Lietuvos bankas' turn to showcase the abundant and diverse culture of its home nation, as Lithuania celebrates the centenary of its restored independence.

Lithuania's cultural heritage is a harmonious melange of historical and present-day, Lithuanian and European influences. During the Renaissance, the Palace of the Grand Dukes of Lithuania in Vilnius was a nexus of European cultural life, with artists flocking to it from all over Western Europe and regular performances of Italian comedies, operas and ballets. Musical traditions originating in the courts of European sovereigns sowed the seeds for a wealth of Lithuanian classical music.

Folk music is also a core part of Lithuania's cultural heritage, and UNESCO has proclaimed the Lithuanian Song Celebration, which the country has organised every four years since its restored independence, as a Masterpiece of the Oral and Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity.

During the European Cultural Days of the ECB in Frankfurt, Lithuania only a fraction of its centuries-long diverse culture. One highlight of the programme will be compositions by Mikalojus Konstantinas Čiurlionis, who became a world-renowned composer and one of Lithuania's most prominent artists.

Continuing with the new format introduced in 2017, the EUROPEAN CULTURAL DAYS features three different cultural experiences, giving you the opportunity to see for yourselves the rich and varied cultural landscape of Lithuania.

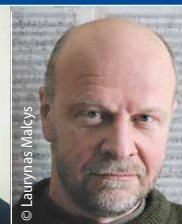
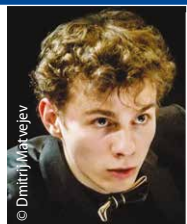
